The audience really enjoyed the competition and gained knowledge on different cultures.

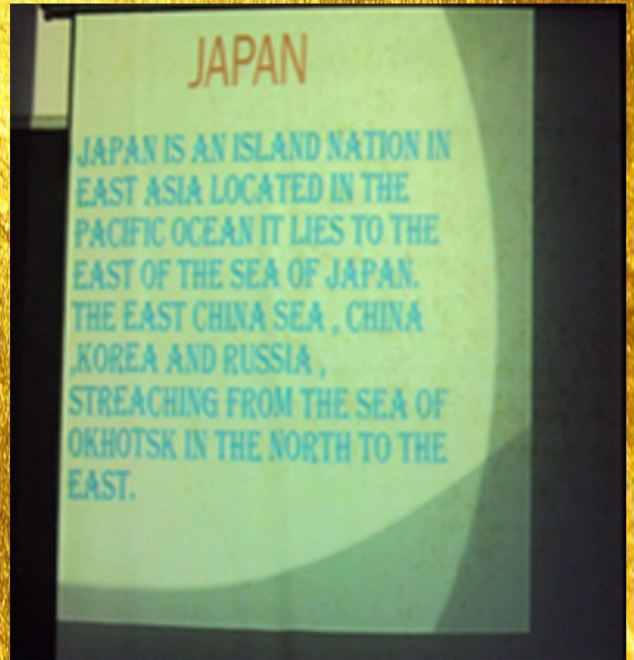

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TEACHER'S REPORT DEBATE COMPETITION

Debate is a formal contest of argumentation between two teams or individuals. Logical consistency, factual accuracy and some degree of emotional appeal to the audience are elements in debating where one side often prevails over the other party by presenting a superior context of the issue.

Debate competition was organized in the classroom on 4th October, 2016. The topic of the Debate was 'INDIAN CULTURE V/S WESTERN CULTURE'. The students were selected according to their capability and ability to debate. Six students were selected out of which three students had to speak on Indian Culture and the other three on Western Culture. The topic was given a week prior. The participants did lots of research and penned down all the points which were relevant to the topic. The participants practiced a lot for this competition taking their teacher's help.



The competition was held in the classroom. The judges were called to judge the competition. Both the teams presented their views and counter-attacked each other with their points and with accurate statistics. The team which spoke for Western Culture won the competition. The participants were judged on certain criteria of judgement viz; Introductory Statement, Use of Language, Argumentation, Relevance to the topic, Conclusion and Overall impact.

The judges expressed their views on the competition. At the end the winners were awarded with the certificates. The main aim of this competition was to make the students aware of both the cultures and respect each other's view keeping in mind that its "MY CULTURE MY WORLD" and to prove that though there is so much difference within us still we have one aim and that is "THINK GLOBAL AND ACT LOCAL".
