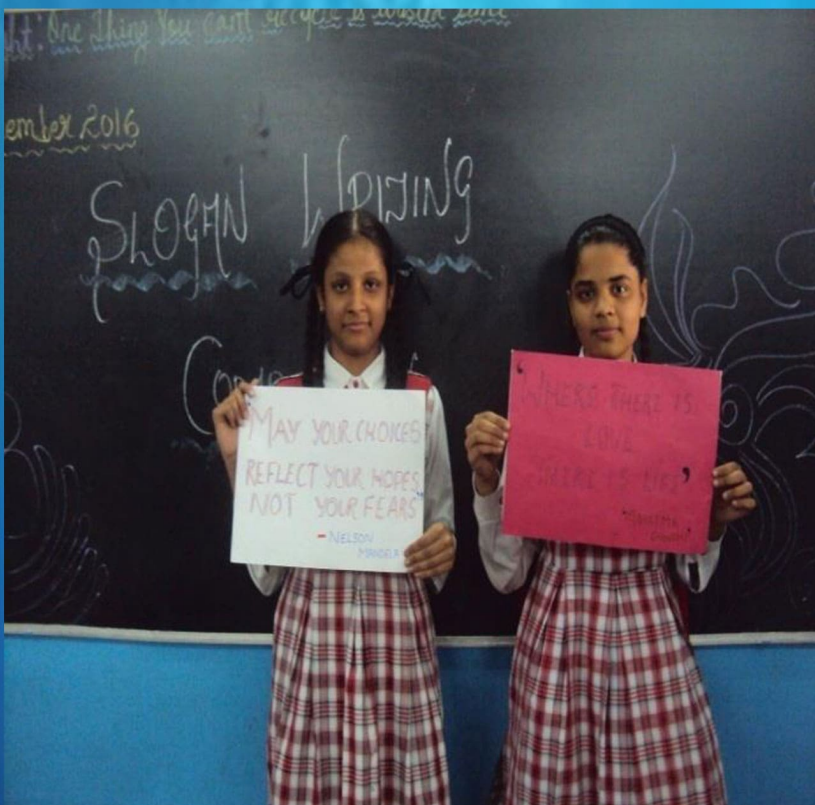
Teachers Report on Slogan Writing Competition
